From there the family moved to Texarkana, where Helen Mae grew up and met an oil field worker by the name of Thomas R. Morris. He was born June 15, 1888, in Fulton, Mississippi, the son of Thomas R. Morris, Sr. and Sarah Caroline _____. Helen Mae Blackburn and Thomas R. Morris were married August 2, 1928 in Texarkana, Arkansas. They moved to Fouke, Arkansas and there they had a daughter born August 15, 1929, and given the name of Martha Jane.

James Lavigga's wife, Martha Ellen died August 9, 1936 and was buried in Rose Hill Cemetery, Texarkana, Texas.

Helen Mae and Thomas R. Morris divorced, and she married Willie Claude Lindsey, September, 1931. At that time Martha Jane was left to live with her grandfather. James L. and Martha Jane moved to Queen City where they lived until he died May 3, 1941. He is buried in Courtland Cemetery.

Willie Claude Lindsey died in 1947 and is buried at Courtland, too.

In 1949 Helen Mae married Jennings C. Tiffin in Texarkana, Arkansas. Martha Jane married Roy A. Williams in December 1950 and they were divorced in 1953. On August 1, 1955, she married Alphus LeRoy Young. He was born April 18, 1928 in Sugartown, Louisiana, the son of James and Adelia (Bailey) Young.

To this union was born three sons: Morris Keith, born June 16, 1956; Jennings Kyle, born November 15, 1960, and Thomas Kerry, born October 27, 1962. All were born in Atlanta, Texas.

James Henry Frost was born in 1850 in Alabama. At an early age his family (Y. H. Frost) left Alabama in 1857, along with the five children and four Negro slaves, heading for Texas by wagon and buggy. The following December they set up camp four miles east of Linden.

James Henry married Eufaula Snipes in 1850. They moved to the Union Chapel community where James Henry was a charter member of the Union Chapel Methodist Church. He and Eufaula had five children.

One of the children was James Clarence Frost, born August 20, 1884. He married Lillie Gholson, an orphan since the age of ten, on February 15, 1909. Clarence was a farmer and rancher and remained in Union Chapel. They had five children.

1. James W. (J.B.), married Atress Randle of Lamesa, Texas. They have two daughters: Elizabeth Ann and Helen. J. B. and Atress live in Jasper where they are retired school teachers. Libby married Buck McLeod and they have Karen, John, and Jim. Libby taught school and Helen still teaches.
